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### **Letter From Co-Chairs**

Dear Supporters and Guests,

Welcome to What She's Made Of! We are so excited to be with you and celebrating Women in Medicine at Highmark Stadium! The mission of the WNY Women's Foundation is to create opportunities for each woman to learn, earn, lead, and thrive. Tonight, we are excited to share a conversation about how that manifests in medicine, and how we can work together to promote a healthy community, address health disparities, and raise awareness to improve outcomes.

Existing data shows that healthier women and their children contribute to more productive and better-educated societies. Moreover, the development and economic performance of nations depends, in part, upon how each country protects and promotes the health of women. Until recently, women's health care focused on breast cancer and conditions of the reproductive organs, ultimately fostering a limited approach to women's well-being. Leading up to the 1960s, research protocols focused almost exclusively on male animal and human cells. It wasn't until the 1980s that the medical community discovered that more women than men were dying of heart disease, which is, in fact, the leading cause of death for women in the United States. Finally, in 1990, the National Institutes of Health founded the Office of Research on Women's Health to improve exploration of diseases, disorders and conditions that affect women. More than a decade later, in 2001, the Institute of Medicine published a groundbreaking report concluding that every cell in the body has a sex and that it is a fundamental variable to consider in research protocols. This study represented a paradigm shift in the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of diseases in women.

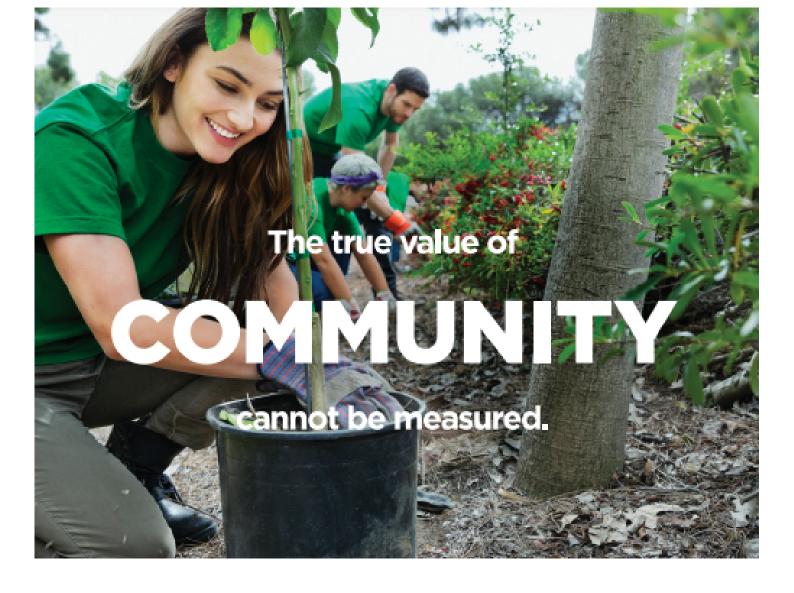
Women's health continues to be less studied than men's health. For instance, 70% of those affected by chronic pain conditions are women, whereas 80% of pain research is conducted on males. Other studies show that resources are often disproportionately allocated to diseases that primarily affect men. Our hope today is to talk about steps that we can take as women to reclaim our health.

As Co-Chairs of this event, we would like to thank our CEO, Sheri Scavone, her staff, and our Committee, whose dedication and passion brought this event to life. Thank you also to our Board members, especially Chair Teresa Bair, for their commitment to our mission. Thank you also to our amazing speakers. We look forward to them sharing their experiences, challenges, and triumphs as they have navigated being women in medicine. Most of all, we thank you – our sponsors and guests. Your support funds our efforts to create significant change in the lives of women in Western New York and beyond.

We believe this is a unique and special time in history for women, and tonight we celebrate the incredible strides that are possible when women join together.
